EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Central Academy for State Forest Service, (CASFOS) Coimbatore under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education, Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change was identified to organize a three days physical mode training of other stake holders on the topic "Forest and Wildlife related Laws" from to 9th to 11th July 2025, for lower Judiciary, Advocates, Law students and members of Law firm.

In this background, a three days training program was planned to sensitize the professionals working in Judiciary about the Forests and Wild life. sector and the various Acts and Rules governing it. Accordingly, nominations for the training were requested from the Lower Judiciary courts, Law Colleges and Private Law firms from the districts neighbouring Coimbatore. About 24 Participants attended the training program.

The module for the training was developed with the expert's input on the subject and feedback received of earlier courses and in-house experience. The training was conducted through Class room lectures with Power Point Presentations, Case study discussion, Panel Discussion and Field Trip to Anamalai and Parambikulam Tiger Reserves.

The training began with inauguration on the first day with Shri, Rajkumar IFS, CCF& Field Director, Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve, Tamil Nadu as Chief Guest in the presence of Shri V. Thirunavukarasu, IFS, APCCF & Principal, CASFOS Coimbatore. The Course Director of the training, Dr. C. Vidhyasagar, IFS., Lecturer, CASFOS gave the welcome address. Shri. V. Thirunavukarasu, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, Coimbatore in his opening remarks, welcomed the Chief Guest Shri. Rajkumar, IFS., Chief Conservator of Forests and Field Director, Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve and all the participants of the training programme. He gave a brief introduction about the forest and issues concerning the forest and wild life conservation. He emphasized the fact that every one of us have a fundamental responsibility to conserve this important natural resource. The Chief Guest of the occasion Shri. Rajkumar, IFS chief Conservator of Forests and Field Director, Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve briefly highlighted the necessity of co-ordination between Executive and Judiciary in control of forest and wild life offences. He expressed his belief that this training will enhance the capacity of Judiciary personnel to understand the various Acts and rules governing our Forests which will strengthen the cause of conservation. 
