EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS) Burnihat under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE), Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, took a step ahead of its mandate and conducted a three-day training programme for Teachers on the theme of "Green Teachers- Conservation Education" w.e.f. 09th to 11th December, 2025. The training was sponsored by the Ministry of Environment, Forests, and Climate Change, Government of India, under its scheme 'Forestry Training & Capacity Building' as part of the Training of Other Stakeholders programme. Teachers, being an important stakeholder in developing environmentally responsible behaviour among the students and younger generation, through further effective conservation education campaigns, this training Course on Green Teachers- Conservation Education was planned and organised. 30 teachers from various schools from Assam & Meghalaya participated with overwhelming enthusiasm in the training.

At the outset, Dr L.C. Bandana, IFS, Course Director, welcomed the participants and guests to the occasion, highlighting the aims and objectives of the Course and its expected outcomes. Shri Rahul M. Rohane IFS, Principal CASFOS Burnihat, felicitated Dr Purnima Devi Barman, Conservation Biologist, a Nari Shakti Purashkar awardee and UNEP Champions of the Earth award recipient, who graced the inaugural session as the Chief Guest, followed by a presentation about the academy. In her inaugural address, Dr Purnima shared the inspiring conservation journey of the Greater Adjutant Stork, locally called Hargila, a critically endangered bird species. She further delivered a lecture session on "Success Story of Community Conservation -Hargila Army" and emphasised that community-led conservation, Women's leadership, and Cultural integration can successfully not only save endangered species but also empower people and bring positive social change.

Guest Speakers/ Resource persons namely Dr. L.C. Bandana, Lecturer CASFOS Burnihat; Dr. Narayan Sharma, Assistant Professor, Cotton University; Dr. T. C. Bhuyan, Scientist- C (Retd.), Consultant, NECBDC; Shri Nilutpal Mahanta, Senior Manager, We Foundation India; Dr. Mohammad Siraj Ansari, Scientist CASFOS Burnihat; Dr. Alolika Sinha, Conservation Biologist, Aranayak, Guwahati; Ms. Sudeshna Gupta, Education Officer, North of England Zoological Society & Freelance, and Shri Rahul M Rohane, IFS, Principal CASFOS Burnihat deliberated on various Conservation related topics in this

training programme.

The topics covered during the Course were Success Story of Community Conservation-Hargila Army, Conservation Ethos & Human Civilisation, Nature Conservation in Urban Landscapes, Overview of Bamboo & Cane sector in India, Citizen Science Application, Awareness on Environment Pollution, Biodiversity Conservation initiatives in North-East India, Engaging Young Minds: effective tools for Conservation Education & Hands-on exercise, Introduction to Mission LiFE. Besides the Lecture room sessions, the participants were taken to the North East Cane & Bamboo Development Council, Burnihat, in the afternoon on 09th December, showing the green infrastructural wonders from the Cane & Bamboo sector. They were also provided exposure to Bird watching & Jeep safari at the Field Visit to Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary on 10th December, and the detailed Schedule showing session-wise Topics and Resource Persons is enclosed as **Annexure-3**.

During the Valedictory session graced by the Principal CASFOS Burnihat and joined by other faculty members, the participants shared their experiences and feedback about the Course, followed by the handed over the Certificates of completion to the participants. The participants were applauded for taking the first step towards Conservation Education by attending such a training programme with the hope that they would take the responsibility of environmental conservation in their respective schools by designing such campaigns.

A total of 32 Teachers from Assam & Meghalaya registered for the training, out of which 30 Teachers were selected on the basis of early registration and participated in the Course, of which 13 were male, and 17 were female. The Course was overwhelmingly appreciated by the participants, who also requested more such training programmes regularly to keep up the momentum of environmental conservation ideas. They also requested such sessions, if possible, at their schools for maximum participation of teachers and students. The presentations made by the experts/resource persons in each session and the photographs during the period were shared with the participants in digital format.

The content of the course was greatly relevant, with a 95% rating & the reading material was highly satisfied, with a 92.50% rating.

Training faculty & their lectures were immensely appreciated by the participants by rating the Contents of their deliberations, Presentation skills, Quality of discussion/interaction and the extent in meeting the objectives at 95.90%, 96.48%, 94.91% and 95.76% respectively. The Field visits were also appreciated and rated at 96.67%.

Accommodation was well appreciated by all of the participants, rating 94% since they stayed in a well-furnished Executive Hostel where modern amenities were made available, and the Food quality was highly appreciated, with a rating of 95.33%. Most of the participants have commented that the Course has been organised well with proper time management, 95.67% and the Classroom/ Conference room facility was also highly rated, 97.33%.

So as to avoid such inconvenience at the planning & preparations of the Academy, the number of participants should be a little flexible, keeping within a range of 30-40.



ABOUT CASFOS

Established in 1976, the Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS) in Burnihat is the first of three academies under the Directorate of Forest Education, Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India. Its primary objective is to provide professional training to State Forest Service (SFS) officers from various States and Union Territories, aiming to produce competent forest managers. Additionally, it provides training to Forest Range Officers (FRO), as well as short-term training courses for personnel from other services such as the Police, ITBP, CRPF and other stakeholders groups like students, teachers, media etc. CASFOS. Burnihat is uniquely located on the border between Assam and Meghalaya, straddling both sides of National Highway 40, commonly known as GS Road, On November 15, 2023, the Academy received the prestigious "अति उत्तम (Atti Uttam)" accreditation from the National Accreditation Board of Education and Training (NABET).

BRIEF HISTORY OF TRAINING

To date, the Academy has trained 614 SFS officers across 19 batches from 28 different States, 518 FROs in 19 batches from 23 States and more than 1000 personnel of other services & stakeholder groups in various short term / refresher courses.

FACILITIES

Three lecture halls, one Computer lab, Library, Auditorium, Conference Hall, Small Museum for showcasing forestry tools, Sports facility including playground, basketball court, tennis court, Trainees' hostel, Executive hostel etc.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Green Teachers- 'Conservation Education'

This Course on Conservation education helps Teachers understand and improve their values toward the environment, guiding them to make wise, sustainable decisions. It aims to shape attitudes, emotions, knowledge, and behaviour regarding forests, wildlife, and nature. The ultimate goal is to create active, conservation-minded citizens through Teachers who share responsibility for maintaining an ecologically balanced and sustainable planet.

ATM

To train Teachers of schools and to develop awareness about the immediate natural environment, plants, animals, etc. They would be able to infuse responsibility of environmental conservation in the younger generation thereafter, through effective Conservation Education campaign designing.

COURSE DESIGN

- Three days offline training
- Practical inputs by discussions with experienced officers, resource persons involved in Conservation.
- > Case studies of successful conservation steps.
- Supported & supplemented by audio visuals and reading material.
- Field visit to expose the participants to various nature conservation issues.

FACILITATORS/RESOURCE

- In-House Faculty having experience in the field of forestry and wildlife.
- Guest Faculty with specialization in dealing with conservation.

DURATION

The course will be of three days duration commencing at 9.30 am on 09th December, 2025 and ending at 04.45 pm on 11th December, 2025. There will be four sessions of about 90 minutes each interspersed with 15 minutes breaks.
